Bylaw No. 38

A BYLAW TO CLASSIFY, LICENCE, REGULATE AND GOVERN BUSINESSES

The Council of the Summer Resort Village of Wakaw Lake,  
in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. Unless otherwise provided in this bylaw, all words and expressions used herein shall have the same meaning given them in the Urban Municipality Act.
2. In this bylaw:
  - a). "General Contractor" means any person who contracts or covenants to do anything for another specifically and who employs one or more sub-contractors.
  - b). "Contractor" means any person who contracts or covenants to do anything for another specifically or who makes a business of executing work according to contract.
  - c). "Sub-Contractor" means any person who contracts to some one other than the ultimate consumer; usually a General Contractor.
  - d). "Employee" means one who works for an employer for wages or salary.
  - e). "Jobber" means one who is self employed and works along by the hour on each job providing labor only.
  - f). "Transient Trader" means a person as defined in the Urban Municipality Act.
  - g). "Person" includes corporation.
  - h). "Others" means anyone not classified specifically in this bylaw.
  - i). "Auctioneer" means every person operating an auction service or selling or offering for sale goods, wares merchandise or effects, by public auction.
3. No person shall carry on any of the businesses set out in Appendix A of this bylaw, with the Resort Village limits unless her/she possesses a valid and subsisting licence for the purpose issued in accordance with the provisions of this bylaw.
4. Licence may be obtained from the Resort Village administrator or any other person acting on his/her behalf, to carry on a business within the Resort Village limits.
  - a). Who is not assessed by the Resort Village for the purposes of business taxation in respect to that business.
  - b). Who pays the proper licence fee as herein provided for in Appendix A of this bylaw.
5. Subject to the right of Council to suspend or revoke the same as provided in the Urban Municipality Act, every licence hereunder issued shall remain in force and effect until and including the 31st. day of December in the year of issue.
6. Where a licence is issued hereunder after September 30th. of any year, the fee payable shall be reduced by 25%, provided that the applicant did not deliberately avoid obtaining a licence prior to September 30th.

7. Every licence issued hereunder shall specifically state the kind of services, goods or merchandise which the licence is authorized to offer for sale or take orders for as the case may be and whether in the case of goods or merchandise, he/she may offer the same for sale by retail or by public auction or both and what hours during which the sale will be conducted.
8. Every person licenced under the bylaw shall, at all reasonable times, upon request of the Resort Village Administrator, Peace Officer or customer, produce such licence for inspection purposes.
9. a). Persons required to be licenced under the provisions of this bylaw are those conducting any of the businesses, trades or callings as defined in Appendix A of this bylaw and the licence fee payable is the fee stated for each category therein.  
b). Licence fee shall be due prior to commencement of business.
10. Any person who violates any provision of this bylaw shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to the penalties as provided in the General Penalty Bylaw of the Summer Resort Village of Wakaw Lake.
11. This bylaw shall take effect and come into force on the 1st. day of December, 1992.
